15 Things to do in the August Garden

- 1 prune roses if you haven't already done so
- 2 divide perennials
- 3 transplant evergreens
- 4 feed garden soil with blood and bone
- 5 deadhead spring bulbs
- 6 plant aquilegia, calendula, candytuft, delphiniums, foxgloves, lupins, alyssum and penstemon seedlings for a Spring show

7 as the soil starts to warm sow seeds of broad bean, cauliflower, spinach, peas, onion, broccoli, silverbeet, lettuce



- 8 spread manure or blood and bone in vegetable gardens
- 9 spray peach trees with Bordeaux before the leaves emerge to help control leafcurl
- 10 feed lemon and other citrus trees with blood and bone or other old animal manures
- 11 time to plant vegetable seedlings but don't start too early in the month and leave carrots until later
- 12 time to plant natives
- 13 dig up vacant beds to aerate the soil
- 14 Treat oxalis before it has time to flower
- 15 plant roses, fruit trees and feed the soil around rhododendrons and camellias later in the month
